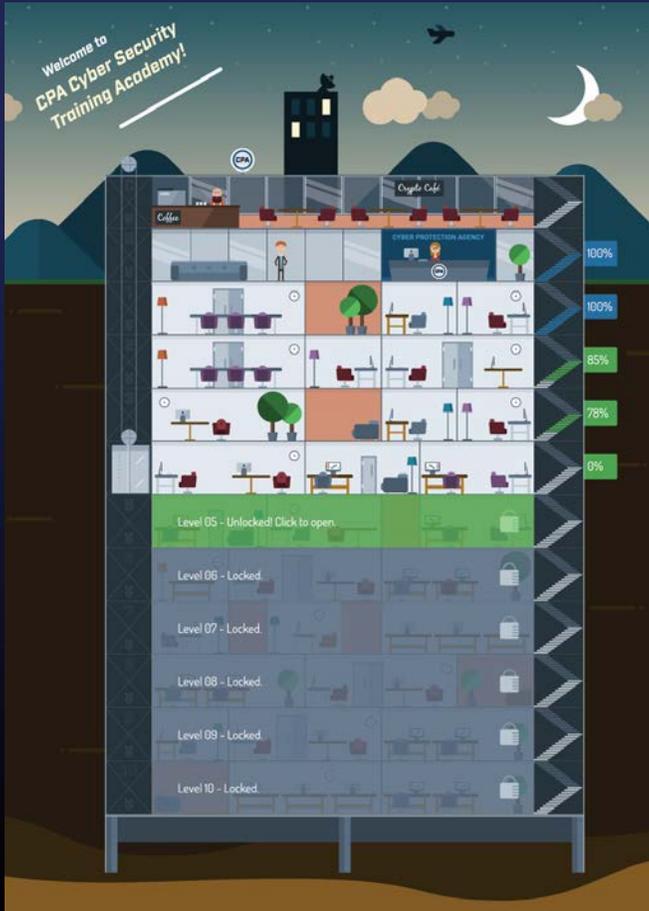

The challenge they are helping to solve

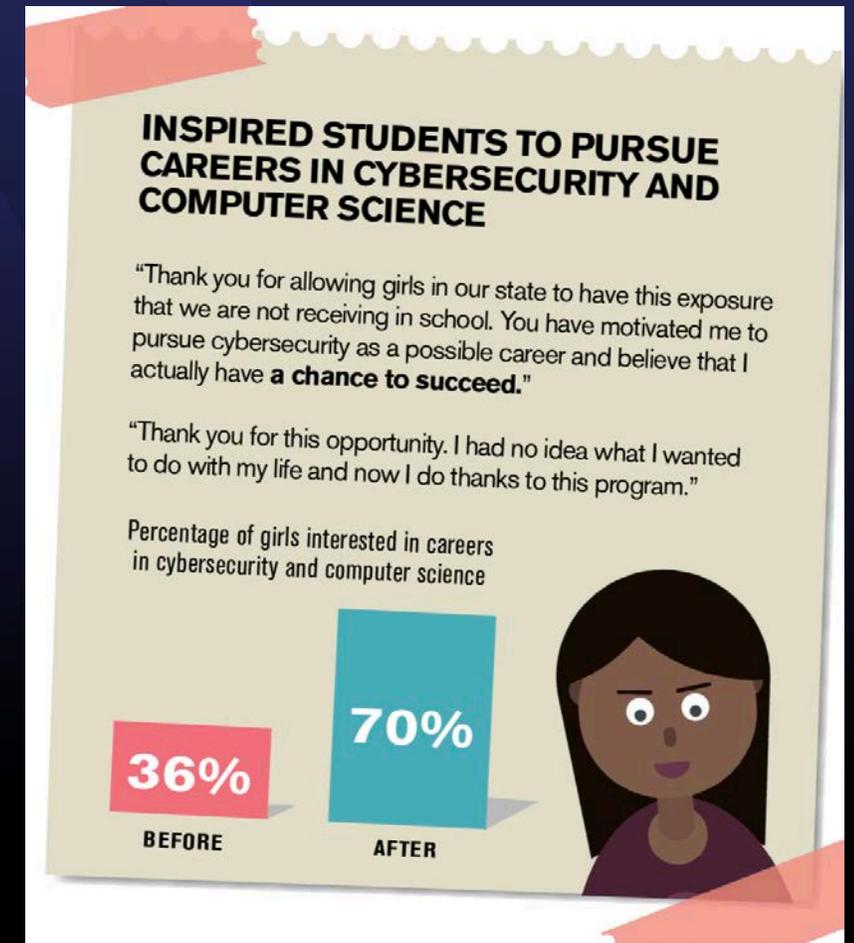
- Online technologies and cyber criminal techniques are becoming more sophisticated. Cyber risk is now a greater concern for CEOs than recession (Fortune Magazine).
- There is a significant global shortage of skilled, trained cyber security professionals. Many talented young people have no idea this is an area where they could excel or how much fun it can be.
- To fill this critical manpower gap, many more young people need to be offered the opportunity to discover whether they like the challenges and whether they have the aptitude to excel.

A suite of challenges and games that:

Part 1. Delaware's High School Leaders (Girls participating)

Delaware high school teachers encouraged 143 girls to try CyberStart – ranking the state 8th out of 27 states in participants per million.

92 girls (64%) were able to solve at least one challenge

Final Results for Girls Go CyberStart

1st in Del.	Charter School Of Wilmington	22 nd in nation
2nd in Del.	Padua Academy	29 th in nation
3rd in Del.	MOT Charter School	67 th in nation

- Girls in 8 high schools won 50 CyberStart licenses for the boys in each of their schools
- 10 girls won \$500 college scholarships
- Delaware total: \$8,450 in Amazon gift cards and college scholarships

2020 Goal for Delaware's Colleges

Participants and participants per 1,000 students

2019 results:

Wilmington University	(75)	5 /1000
Delaware Technical Community College	(28)	2 /1000
University of Delaware	(11)	0.5/1000
Delaware State University	(4)	1 /1000

2020 Goal: Enable more college students to discover their talent by increasing participation rates in the colleges – possibly to 5/1000 statewide – total 275+

2020 Goals for Delaware's High Schools

Double the number of high schools, double the number of girls per high school, increase the number of schools where boys get to play, too.

Number of teachers involved: 22 → 44

Number of participants per teacher: 6.5 → 13

Total girls participating: 144 → 572

Schools where boys play, too: 8 (400) → 12 (600)
